



Energy Sense Rebates for 2022 See Little Change

Did you know that Dunn Energy Cooperative has an extensive list of rebates and incentives for energy efficient purchases? Each year the list us updated to make sure we are incentivizing purchases that create the best savings for our members. This year, very few changes have been made:

- Removed incentives on flow restrictors (shower and faucet) and on smart power strips.
- Increased incentives on Heat Pump: Air source and mini-split and commercial & PTHPs from \$250/ton to \$300/ton

November 2021 Board Meeting Highlights



Monthly Reports:

Operations reported on the large outage in mid-November. A transmission line serving the western side of our system suffered an outage. Outages stretched from

Baldwin to Durand and included our Comfort (Eau Galle) and Lucas substations. Members were off for approximately 90 minutes.

Crews worked hard to get as much wire as possible in the ground before it got too cold. We have put in 129 new services to-date.

The Energy Services report contained an update on supply chain issues. An order was placed for meters and is not expected to be delivered until April of 2022. There was also an order placed for Electric Vehicle (EV) chargers. We were notified of a 28-week lead time on that order.

It was also reported that the SunDEC Community solar is 92% subscribed. Only 31 units remain. The current price per share is just over \$500.

October financials showed that October kWh sales were about 2.5% less than budget and revenues were shy of budget by 1.2%. The CFO also sought the approval of the annual write-offs of uncollectible accounts.

The CEO/General Manager shared that bids went out for the planned office remodeling project. There was good attendance at the contractor walk-through. Bids are due back November 30th.

The following items were approved:

- Minutes of the October 2021 Board meeting
- Capital credit estate payout for deceased members.
- Audit committee report of all checks, ACH payments, wire transfers, credit card statements, and investments accounts.
- Installation of replacement heat recovery unit
- PCA credit on November bills
- Annual write-off of uncollectible accounts

Director Zwiefelhofer reported on Dairyland Power activities for the month.
