Operation Round Up Giving Guidelines

Our mission is:

ORU contributions will be used primarily in the local area for charitable, educational and community needs to help provide opportunities for long-range enhancement of the communities' quality of life.

Evaluation factors are:

- **Generally** awarded to non-profit programs, projects and organizations that improve the quality of life in our local communities and
- **Emphasize:** public safety, health care, self-sufficiency, basic human needs, our cultural environment, community leadership and social issues for youth.
- Only one grant per year will be awarded to an organization.

Funding restrictions are:

Contributions are **generally** not awarded to:

- lobbying
- political causes
- religious causes
- veteran organizations
- fraternal organizations
- fundraising dinners
- raffles or events
- individuals
- capital fund campaigns
- scholarship programs
- general operating funds
- national fund drives
- advertising

If your program requires overheads/administrative costs to be written into your grant, Dunn Energy Co-op requires an itemized print out detailing these costs, so if the board chooses, they can omit funding for those costs.
